When visiting with an infant, (+1-855-546-5011) it is necessary to understand the infant policy that Air France has. Even though infants have no age limitation, Air France (+1-855-546-5011) does not recommend parents fly in the period of one week after the baby is born or when the child is sick. What will be the price of an Air France infant seat?

Details about the reservation procedure are provided below.

- Families with children (+1-855-546-5011) under the age of 14 are eligible for free seat reservations under the infant policy, provided that they are booked in the same file. Payment can be (+1-855-546-5011) made online using the "my booking" feature, and reservations can be made up to two days prior to the flight.
- Families can benefit from unique services provided by Air France.
- It's crucial to note that Air France provides some excellent family services, which are covered below:

- Inflight services in flights that exceed 2.5 hours include children aged between 3 and 8 years being served a unique lunch according to their preferences and needs. In making reservations or (+1-855-546-5011) purchase of tickets, children under 11 years of age should indicate this accommodation at least 24 hours before departure.
- Children between the ages of two and eleven receive pencils, coloring books, games, Planete Bleue magazine, and a High Flier diploma from the crew.
- Infants with (+1-855-546-5011) Air France infant ticket (2.5 hours and above) will be offered a special supper with cookies and baby food. This lunch should be ordered by the passengers at least 24 hours prior to departure during the reservation or purchase of a ticket.

When is the best time to book a seat for your infant?

Here are some pointers on when to book a seat for your infant:

- In cases of young ones below two years of age, they do not need to have a seat reservation so that they can ride on the laps of an adult.
- A car seat can be used to (+1-855-546-5011) keep the babies comfortable and safe during the flights.

- Travelling by air means that parents must ensure the safety of their infants in an approved and certified car seat or carrier as well as purchase their own seat.
- You should reserve by the phone when you are travelling with two infants below the age of two years, and one of them should have his own seat.

An infant in arms on Air France: what is it?

Travelling with a child who is under the age of two, you can put him in an FAA-approved child safety seat or on your lap. Nevertheless, children below the age of two and above two days have to travel as babies due to safety concerns.



Is it possible to book a lap infant on Air France?

If you would like a bassinet for your baby on an Air France flight, you must call the airline at least 48 hours before to departure. Your baby will have to travel on your lap if there isn't a bassinet available.

Can I add an infant after my Air France ticket is already booked?

Yes, in most cases you can add an infant to your [Air France booking](#) even after your ticket has been issued. This can usually be done by contacting Air France directly or through the travel agency where you booked your flight. It's best to do this as early as possible, as airlines have limits on the number of infants allowed per flight.

Will Air France charge me for a lap infant?

Air France generally charges a reduced fare for lap infants (infants travelling without their own seat). The cost often depends on the route and whether the flight is domestic or international. Taxes and fees may still apply, so it's a good idea to confirm the exact charges before travelling.

What if I want my infant to have a seat?

If you prefer your infant to have a separate seat, you'll need to purchase a child fare. In this case, an approved child restraint system or car seat may be required. Booking a seat for your infant offers extra comfort and is recommended for longer flights.

Do I need documents for my infant (+1-855-546-5011)?

Yes, infants need proper travel documents. For domestic flights, a birth certificate may be required, while international travel usually requires a valid passport and, in some cases, a visa. Always check destination requirements in advance.

When is the best time to add my infant?

The best time to add an infant is right after booking your ticket. Early notification helps ensure availability, smoother seat arrangements, and fewer last-minute issues before departure.
